



New Year, New Interactive Tool Encourages Parent/Educator Partnerships

BALTIMORE (January 21, 2020) – The Maryland State Department of Education's (MSDE) Division of Early Childhood has launched a new interactive tool on the Maryland Families Engage website, the virtual Maryland Early Childhood Family Engagement Toolkit. The goal of the new and improved Toolkit is to help teachers, providers, parents, and families build a network of community support and share best practices.

The MSDE Division of Early Childhood, in collaboration with the Johns Hopkins University Institute for Innovation in Development, Engagement, and Learning Systems (IDEALS) Institute designed the new and improved online version of the Toolkit to guide educators through the state's Family Engagement Framework. The Toolkit features a variety of updated content with navigational tabs that provide easy access to family engagement strategies, topics, and success stories in the form of articles, videos, infographics, and downloadable resources.

Originally created in 2016 as a colorful box set with large informational cards, the online version of the Toolkit was developed based on feedback from the state's early learning communication for groups conducted last year, educators requested a more user-friendly Toolkit. Educators requested a toolkit that would be less text-driven and highlight family engagement strategies "in action" with success stories featuring families and educators on the Maryland Families Engage website.

In July 2018, the MSDE Division of Early Childhood launched the state's family engagement community hub, MarylandFamilusEngage.org. Through funding from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, the website serves as a "one-stop shop" for parents, families, providers, teachers, and other stakeholders to share resources that promote school readiness, positive parent-child relationships, and the benefits of family engagement.

CRAFT

Dot Painting Lesson Plan

Book to read: The Dot by Peter H. Reynolds-Read the story to the children.

Explain to the children what inside and outside means – teaching positional words and opposites.

Have children trace a circle onto a piece of paper – I used an open circle from a stacking puzzle.

Explain that they can either paint their dots inside the circle or outside the circle.

Provide a pallet with different color paints and Q-tips to paint with. Explain that they will need to change their Qtip with each new color they dot with, if they don't they will create brown, which is ok. Provide a paper plate for the discarded Q-tips. Show children how to make a dot using the Q-tip and then let them go. My kids spent about 20 minutes working on these. Ages 2 ½ - 5. The one-year old made brown!





LION AND LAMB CRAFT

What You Need

- · White paper plates, two per student
- · 9- by 12-inch brown construction paper, one sheet per student
- · 9- by 12-inch orange or yellow construction paper, one sheet per student
- · 9- by 12-inch white construction paper, one sheet per 2 students
- 9- by 12-inch pink construction paper, one sheet per 2 students
- · Scissors

- · Glue
- · Cotton balls

Craft sticks, two per student

What You Do

- 1. Cut the 9- by 12-inch white and pink construction paper into halves.
- 2. Have your students cut the centers out of their paper plates and discard them. You will have to cut out the paper plate centers for young students.
- 3. To make the lion mask, have your students cut or tear small pieces, approximately 1-inch squares, from the brown and orange or yellow construction paper.
- 4. Have your students glue the strips onto one of their paper plate rims to make the lion's mane. Set these aside to dry.
- 5. To make the lamb mask, have your students glue cotton balls to the second paper plate rim so the paper plate surface is completely covered. Set these aside to dry.
- 6. The students should cut two 2-inch wide circles from the brown construction paper.
- 7. Next, have the students cut two 1-inch wide circles from the orange or yellow construction paper.
- 8. Help your students glue the smaller circles onto the center of the larger circles. These will represent ears.
- 9. Have your students glue the ears to the back of the lion paper plate rim so they peek out from the top of the paper plate, as shown.
- 10. Have the students repeat steps 5 through 8 to create the lamb's ears, using the white construction paper for the larger circles and pink construction paper for the smaller circles.
- 11. Help your students glue craft sticks to the backs of their animal plates to create handles for the masks.

12. Your students can put on the mask to become like spring: in like a lion or out like a lamb!


